OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY AT FLOWER FOUNDATION

As the new and first Occupational Therapist to join the Flower Foundation team, I was excited, nervous and terrified all in one! The task of developing the OT role for the Flower Foundation is enormous and always evolving. This, however, fits so well into what OT is all about. OT is a dynamic, holistic and adaptable approach to managing daily life. OT strives to help others to do what they find meaningful so that they can experience a quality of life. Thus, OT is not a singular and independent approach, but rather a person-centred approach to making a change for the better.

I work closely with the Activity Coordinators at six of the Flower Foundation villages: Silver Stream, Witpoortjie, Elm Park, WGMC, Willowbrook and Pioneer House. For each of the Activity Coordinators this has also been a change, however, I believe a change for the better. Each activity coordinator, along with myself, plan an individualised and structured activity program for

each care centre. This includes a variety of activities from sensory stimulation, arts and crafts, leisure tasks, cognitive stimulation and physical activities to name a few. Each activity coordinator plans a monthly special event for each village. This can include anything from outings to a large function such as the Elm Park Fashion Parade on Spring Day. The activities may fit into a special theme for the month, for example Mother's Day or Heritage Day, or may just be something usually enjoyed by our residents, such as a trusty bingo game.

The Activity Coordinators meet with myself on a monthly basis during a meeting. We then have training on some topics appropriate to our working environment such a normal ageing, Areas of Occupation, or statistics to name a few. We then also have some fun and learn a new activity, presented each month by our host village Activity Coordinator. These activities can then be adapted to be done at each village.

As an OT I also love to share my knowledge and have done so on a few occasions. We have arranged a few information sessions with residents regarding Dementia, what Occupational Therapy is and the role of and OT in geriatrics, Stroke Awareness and Heart Health. I have also started assessments on residents to establish a baseline of their occupational function and activity levels. Along with the Activity Coordinators, I plan to assess each resident in our care centres at the Flower Foundation. This way, we can better

plan and implement appropriate activity programs for the people in whose homes we work.

Occupational Therapists help people of all ages develop the skills they need for success in everyday life where they live, learn, work and play.

WATERWISE GARDENS ARE THE WAY TO GO

Silver Stream Village recently embarked on a landscaping exercise with the assistance of Edwena from Eco Landscapers. With Gauteng currently experiencing a water shortage having eco-friendly and water wise gardens is imperative. Edwena with the assistance of the gardeners and residents set out to convert the communal gardens at the village to be just that. Succulents were used in the flower beds and overgrown plants have been harvested and tidied up.


Edwena shared some *tips* for a waterwise and eco-friendly garden:

- Use succulents these plants do not require a lot of watering
- Plant Astro Turf in small areas maintaining grass areas are not only expensive but also very time consuming. Astro Turf is laid like a carpet and is made of recyclable plastic which makes it long wearing
- Using sprinklers to water is far more effective than a hose-pipe.
- Avoid using weed-killer, the chemicals leach into the subsoil and contaminates our water sources. Use boiling water, it will kill anything your pour it on. It keeps the paving clean and it doesn't poison the soil.
- In very shaded areas, plant mondo grass, this is a slow growing plant and requires minimal care once it has established.
- Pot plants Poke a few holes into a two-litre bottle, pierce holes at the top of the bottle and dig it into the pot plant. This will slowly release the water ensuring that the roots of the plants are getting the water it needs and no flooding will occur.
- Wonder Waterwise Crystals absorbs water and last approximately 5 months. Use a small amount of the product otherwise it will grow to the extent that it will flow out the pot.

A bit about Edwena



She is currently sharing her knowledge at Silver Stream and Witpoortjie by training the gardeners of the villages on how to maintain a waterwise garden. She will continue sharing her knowledge throughout the Flower Foundation villages
